Because a peer review process is used in proposal selection, I encourage you to look through the Speaker Guidelines and note the criteria that will be used by the Program Committee when reviewing proposals. Please remember that NCSM is a mathematics education *leadership* organization, so your presentation should be a learning opportunity for mathematics education leaders. Also, please take special care in composing your title and description. The Program Committee will look for well-written proposals that meet the criteria and whose titles and descriptions communicate the content of the session in a manner that will attract attendees. Please understand that the Program Committee typically receives many more proposals than it can accept, thus we won’t be able to accommodate many good proposals.

On behalf of the Conference Committee, I thank you for your willingness to contribute to the 2011 NCSM Annual Conference by submitting a proposal. Regardless of whether your proposal is accepted, I hope to see you in Indianapolis for a PRIME professional development and networking experience.
